Soft Copy of the cover page, abstract and Full length Research Paper should be sent to atmanirbharbharat75@gmail.com on or before 31st December 2022.

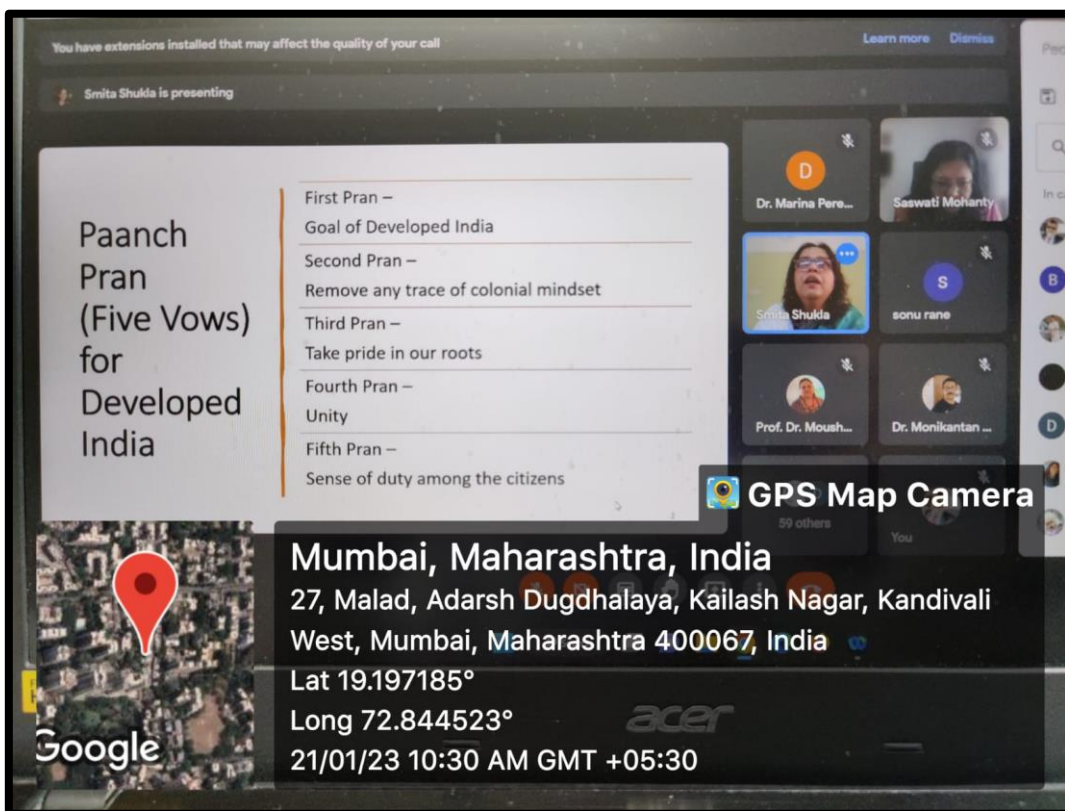
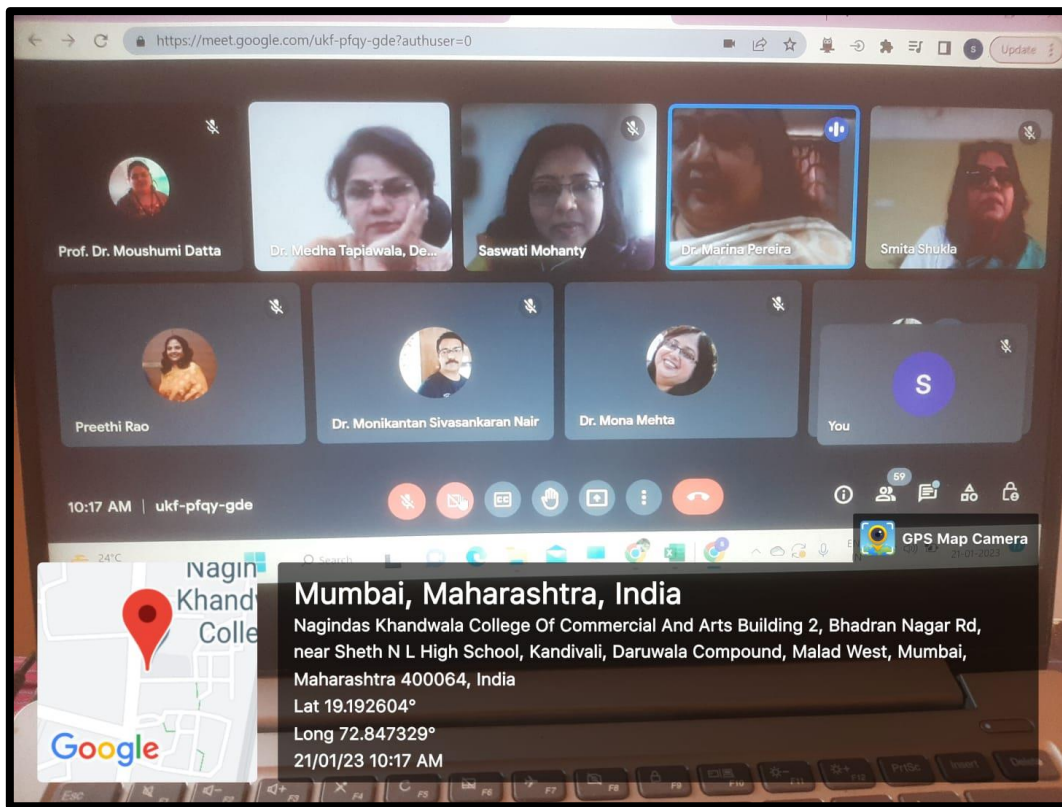
